# Support to Government Inter College, Guniyal Gaon, Chandrothi Gram Sabha.

Committed towards providing enhanced quality of healthy and hygienic life to the residents of Dehradun, Antara Senior Living through the efforts of Max India Foundation (MIF) initiated developmental works at Inter College, Guniyal Gaon, Chandrothi Gram Sabha. The Development Initiatives were formally inaugurated by **Mrs. Tara Singh Vachani ( CEO & MD - Antara Senior Living)** on April 17<sup>th</sup>. 4 toilets for girl students, a badminton court, so that the girls can exercise and RO System for safe drinking water has been provided to the school.



## World Immunization Week (24th - 29th April)

India has the second highest number of Hepatitis B infected, second only to China. Each year, one lakh patients die of viral Hepatitis (including Hepatitis B and C) in India. Government initiatives to screen people for Hepatitis B, immunize them, and treat the infected has been woefully under-funded.

**Good Samaritans like Surender Kumar who himself found out about his Hep B infection only during a blood donation camp has initiated a program through his organization Rann Bhoomi Foundation. "There is little awareness among people about this disease in rural areas of India" Kumar explained. "I knew we needed a mass awareness program to teach people how to prevent this. Max India Foundation has organized 5 Hepatitis B immunization camps in partnership with Rann Bhoomi Foundation & immunized around 160 underprivileged children of ages 6-16 years who don't qualify for Govt Immunization program. We are thankful to Max India Foundation for the support provided for the success of our program."**
