TRADITIONAL BIRTH ATTENDANT TRAINING (DAI)

On the request of the Chief Minister of Uttarakhand, MIF organized training for traditional birth attendants (or Dai) across the thirteen districts of the state. As much of the population lives in far flung areas, institutional births are not always possible. With this initiative we hope to drastically reduce the incidence of maternal and child mortality.

The Dehradun district Dai training phase was officially inaugurated on 4th June in Dehradun by the Honorable Health Minister Uttarakhand, Shri Surender Singh Negi. The Director General Health Services, Dr. Bhatt and Dr. SK Agarwal, Chief Medical Officer, Dehradun were also present and spoke on the occasion lauding the initiative.



A STITCH IN TIME SAVES NINE..... SECONDARY AND TERTIARY HEALTHCARE

MIF provides surgery and treatment support to patients from the economically weaker section of the society and patients referred by NGOs. To date over 4315 patients have been supported.

- This month 9 peadiatric cardiac surgeries were conducted by Dr. Dagar and his team for children referred by Genesis Foundation and Afghan Red Crescent Society for surgical correction of the congenital heart anomalies at Max Hospital, East block, Saket.
- MIF facilitated treatment support for 5 patients suffering from different ailments including paralysis, colon cancer, spine dislocation, reconstructive surgery of the hand and heart disease at Max Hospitals (Saket and Dehradun). Cataract surgery for a case referred by NGO Samarpan was facilitated through MIF at Max Hospital, Panchsheel.
- MIF facilitated free health consultations for children of NGO Tara Homes for Children and NGO Udayancare in Max Hospital Panchsheel, Noida and Patparganj.
- MIF in association with HANS Foundation facilitated 5 cochlear implant surgeries at Max Hospital, East Block, Saket.

MIF through its Pan - India Immunization program has reached out across India. To date **48238** children have been immunized (some have received multiple shots) through **776** camps.

 In the month of June, 20 Immunization camps were successfully conducted through our NGO partners - Chetnalaya, Gianelli Sadan, Centre for Equity Studies, Banjara Mahila, Feedback Foundation, Samarpan and Bella Healthcare. These camps were conducted in and on the outskirts of Delhi (Sunder Nagri, Bhatti Mines, Sangam Vihar, Kalyanpuri, Bhalasva, Mukundpur, Shahadara, Bavana, Chabiganj, Mehrauli, Adarsh Nagar, Nala Colony, Majnu Ka tila, Kotla and Deoli village) and Dehradun. 587 children were given vitamin A and de-worming tablets.

HEALTH AWARENESS

- A film on **Oral Health and Hygiene** and **Cancer Awareness** was screened for **200** people during the health checkup camp organized in association with NGO Chetnalaya on 9th June in Sunder Nagri.
- During the health camp at Dhakrani, 34 people were educated on TB, 18 were educated on healthy eating habits, 192 villagers were educated on importance of girl child, 25 on healthy environment and 39 were educated on maintaining oral hygiene.
- A puppet show on Health and Hygiene by puppeteers of Katputli Colony was watched by **100** children of NGO Gianelli Sadan in Deoli village during the immunization camp on 18th June.

HEALTH CAMPS

In June 28 camps were organized through our NGO partners. We have reached out to 104684 people through 473 health camps to date.

3 Multi Speciality Health camps were organized in the month of June

- a) Max India Foundation in association with Max Healthcare, Greater Noida organized its 1st multi speciality camp in village Swarajpur, Greater Noida on 20th June. The camp received a total footfall of 100 villagers. Random blood sugar and BP were checked and free medicines were provided to the needy.
- b) A multi speciality medical camp was organized by Max Speciallity Films Limited in collaboration with Max India Foundation and Max Healthcare, Mohali at village Paniali Khurd, Punjab on 20th June. The camp inaugurated by Dr. Kulwaran Singh, District Health Officer, SBS Nagar benefitted 387 patients who were examined by a team of medical specialists (Cardiology, Gynecology, Ophthalmology and Orthopedics) from Max Super Speciality Hospital, Mohali. Besides conducting ECG & routine tests like BP & blood sugar, free medicines were dispensed to all patients.
- c) Max Healthcare, Dehradun and Max Life Insurance in association with MIF organized a multi speciality camp in village **Dhakrani**, **Uttarakhand** on 18th June. **110** people received free consultation and medicines at the camp.

Monthly health checkup for children of NGO Jamghat – Dr. Rohit Saini conducted general health checkup for 35 children at the daycare centre in Old Delhi on 4th June and Dr. Ankit for 25 children in Lado Sarai centre.

Bi - weekly health camps in association with Bella Healthcare - General health checkups conducted on 1st and 2nd June for **88** people, 8th and 9th June for **141 people**, 22nd and 23rd June for **145** people and 29th and 30th June for **164** people in upper and lower **Dhakrani village**, **Dehradun**. Free consultations and medicines were provided.

General health camps – **5** camps were organized reaching out to **460** people through our partner NGOs Avon, SETU, Chetnalaya and Gianelli Sadan covering village Nithari and Salarpur in Noida, Palam, Kalyanpuri and Deoli village in Delhi.

Comprehensive General/Peadiatric camps - 8 camps were organized in and around Delhi (Holambi Kalan, Bhatti Mines, Narela, Savda Ghera, Mukundpur, Sunder Nagri, Sangam Vihar and Kotla) in association with NGO Chetnalaya and Samarpan benefitting 1180 people.

Peadiatric camps – **2** camps in association with NGO partners Sarthak and Chetnalaya were organized benefitting **175** children in locations **Paschim Vihar and Bavana**.
