HPV is responsible for 76.7% of Cervical Cancer Cases in India

HPV Awareness and Vaccination Drive - A full fledged campaign on HPV awareness and vaccination was started last month in association with partner NGOs. The campaign is aimed at creating HPV awareness and providing immunization protection to young girls. Team MIF along with the team of doctors and nurses, have immunized 472 girls and educated 886 young girls and women on prevention and protection against HPV which has become a leading cause of cervical cancer.

“ It was a challenge to convince and raise awareness in the community which had no clue about Cervix Cancer in the first place because of the several associated taboos. The awareness sessions helped address their concerns about vaccination and also sensitized community on prevalence of the disease. It was gratifying to see the huge turn up of young girls for vaccination. ”

Rishabh, is a 3 year old boy with severe hearing disability. His father, Rajbir works as a security guard at an ATM and is paid Rs 7,000 per month. The doctor at a Government Hospital advised several medical tests including MRI scan. This needed to be done immediately else, Rishabh's condition would have been irreparable after 6 months. MRI was very expensive and unfortunately, the hospital had a huge waiting for MRI scan (6 months).

At this time, Samarpan Foundation approached Max India Foundation for help. An appointment was fixed for the next day and the scan was done.

Guddiya, 60 years old, lives in a hutment with 8 members of her family surviving on a monthly income of Rs 6000. She had a major uterus infection. Owing to money constrains, she could not get herself treated and suffered.

Samarpan Foundation approached Max India Foundation for supporting her treatment. An appointment was fixed by MIF staff. The doctor checked her thoroughly and because of the prescribed medicines, the infection was healed.
