Spectacles provided to the needy

A multi specialty medical camp was organized for the people of village Behram Pur Bet in Chandigarh on 28th June, 2014. After this camp 40 people of whom 27 were women, were donated spectacles by Mr. SP Bansal, AVP-HR, Max Specialty Films. Also, those identified for cataract surgeries have been lined up for surgery at Max hospital, Mohali. surgeries and treatments.




A general health check-up camp

Surgeries and Treatments supported by Max India Foundation in September:

- A 28-year old man from a low socio-economic background developed profound bilateral hearing loss following a trauma injury. He was supported by Max India Foundation with a cochlear implant for his ear, placed by Dr Sachdev at MHC, Saket.
- A 2-year old boy belonging to a marginalized family, was born with a rare congenital anomaly of the heart called Tetralogy of Fallot. He was supported by Max India Foundation for surgical correction of this anomaly at MHC, Saket.
- A preterm (premature) newborn baby who required life support on a ventilator in the ICU for an extended period at Max hospital, Shalimar Bagh, was supported by Max India Foundation for receiving the requisite life support.
- A 1-year old boy from a poor community born with a congenital ventricular septal defect in the heart was supported by Max India Foundation to receive a surgical closure of the anomaly at MHC, Saket
- A 30-year old man had a leg amputation in an unfortunate train accident. We got him the required replacement for his prosthesis.
- One homeless child residing in an orphanage run by NGO Tara Homes, was treated for eye infection at Max, Panchsheel Park, with support from the foundation.

To date 3532 needy patients have received support from Max India Foundation for their surgeries and treatments.



Max India Foundation provided its monthly nutritional and medicinal support to 500 homeless children /orphans living in shelters of NGO partners Jamghat and Palna in Delhi and Purkul Youth Development Society in Uttarkhand.

Other Centres

GDA Training Program A vocational training (duty attendant) program was conducted in support from Max India Foundation for 32 slum dwellers.

To date 151 jobless youth have undergone free-of-charge training through the foundation and are now employed, mostly with Max hospitals.

Water Purifier (RO system) donated to a school in Rail Majra, Chandigarh

in a camp in Vasant Vihar, Delhi

Max India Foundation with support from Max Specialty Films, donated a water purifier (RO system) to Guru Ram Rai Public School in Village Behram Pur Bet, Chandigarh. Volunteers of MSF's HR team were present-on-the-occasion.

The students and staff of this underprivileged school now have access to uninterrupted supply of safe drinking water.

All 114 children with special needs, residing in AICB Blind school, Gurgaon, received ENT check-up and MMR vaccine

Health Centres

1600 patients attended health clinics run or supported by Max India Foundation at Rail Majra, Chandigarh; Chinmaya health centre, CanSuport field centre and India Foundation Health centre in Delhi; and Ukimath health centre and Guniyal gaon in Uttarakhand. To date 1,35,211 patients have benefitted from these health centres.

10th September: A comprehensive health check-up was carried out for 24 street children of Lado Sarai, Delhi of NGO, Jamghat by Dr. Mitul Jain of Max hospital, Saket. Max India Foundation organizes monthly health check-ups for these children.

9th September: 150 people benefitted from a general health check camp in a village in Pitampura. Dr Roopali Nath Mathur of Max hospital, Shalimar Bagh carried out the health check-up. Free-of-cost medicines were given out for common ailments.

23rd September: A comprehensive ENT check-up was carried out for all 114 children with special needs of AICB Blind School, Gurgaon by ENT specialist, Dr Alpana Giri of Max Healthcare, Gurgaon.

To date 71686 people from the marginalised population have benefitted from these camps.

Max India Foundation conducted 2 blood donation camps where Max Life Insurance employees, Gurgaon, donated a total of 148 units. The donations were created as a preparation for the dengue outbreak. To date the foundation has managed to collect 4873 units of blood.

To date 38626 underprivileged children have been immunized with a total of 71844 shots through our immunisation camps.

In the month of September, Max
India Foundation conducted 20
immunisation camps across 5
states and provided vaccination to
2495 underprivileged children
(homeless/ orphans/dropouts/children of migrant
labour/poor community) in the
following locations:

Nala camp, Chabiganj, Tehkhand, Devli village, Tiz Hazari and Vasant Vihar in Delhi; Barola village, Khoda, Swarn Nagri, Garhi, Sarfabad in Uttar Pradesh; Lakkarpur and Sohna Road in Haryana; Bhubaneshwar in Orissa; and Amritsar, Ludhiana and Sangrur in Punjab.

In these camps the children were given one of the vaccines: MMR, Typhoid, Hepatitis B, MMR, DPT, DT, TT. Each community receives the whole set of vaccines through multiple camps.
